profitability, as well as lower employee turnover; and

WHEREAS: Minnesota is committed to building a more fair and just society by eliminating gender barriers and

supporting women who seek to expand their career options through the positive experiences and

employment opportunities offered by apprenticeships; and

WHEREAS: Economic equality for all Minnesotans is measured not only by protection from discrimination, but

also by equal and fair access to quality job opportunities. Registered apprenticeships offer a critical

pathway for women to participate equally and fully in Minnesota's growing economy; and
